

CHAPTER 2

SECTION 1

ORGANIZATION

2-1. General Authority. Title 10, Article 2, Chapter 8, Indiana Military Code.

2-2. Scope. This chapter prescribes the organization of the Indiana Guard Reserve.

2-3. TO Units. The IGR, for administrative control and training purposes, will be constituted as stated in Section 3 of this chapter or as may be revised under future TO's approved by The Adjutant General.

2-4. Personnel. The IGR will be composed of officers, enlisted personnel and such other citizens who shall volunteer or enlist for service therein, who meet qualifications prescribed by Chapter 3 of this regulation.

2-5. Authorization Documents. All units will be organized in accordance with a Table of Organization (TO) approved by The Adjutant General.

2-6. Command and Supervision. TAG is designated as the Governor's senior military representative for the State of Indiana. The Commanding General, IGR is charged with the supervision, coordination, and administration of the IGR in conformity with the policies and procedures approved by TAG

2-7. Table of Organization. A complete Table of Organization is maintained at IGR Headquarters.

SECTION 2

GENERAL

2-8. Purpose. This section prescribes the policies and procedures relative to the organization and administration of the Indiana Guard Reserve (IGR).

2-9. Concept. The IGR is established in order to be prepared for any eventuality, and realizing the necessity for rapid reaction, if and when the Indiana National Guard is mobilized into Federal service, or otherwise unavailable for State service. The IGR will plan and train for the possibility of the assumption of missions and responsibilities as directed by the Governor and as ordered by the Adjutant General of the State of Indiana.

2-10. Mission.

a. The mission of the IGR is to provide an adequately trained and organized State military defense force under the exclusive control of the Governor of Indiana, capable of accomplishing those state emergency responsibilities normally assigned to the Indiana National Guard, when that force is federalized or otherwise not available to the needs of the Governor. In addition, they would be available to perform any such missions as the Governor directs, within Federal and State laws concerned.

b. Assigned Missions. (See Para 1-5 c, Chapter 1)

c. Under direction from The Adjutant General, the IGR will:

(1). Prepare plans, policies, procedures, regulations, and Tables of Organization (TO), Equipment (TE), Allowances (TA), and Distribution (TD), for the IGR.

(2). Recruit and train officers and enlisted personnel and the authorized soldiers necessary to form a viable and effective cadre force to permit the IGR to accomplish its assigned missions and responsibilities.

(3). Make a study of personnel in Indiana with a view to their qualifications and availability for IGR service upon its activation. In addition, plan for the recruitment of eligible personnel for service in the IGR to acquire strength desired.

(4). Make a study of facilities to be prepared to take over in an orderly manner those existing armories and State equipment and supplies located therein.

SECTION 3
STRUCTURE

2-11. Scope. This section prescribes the organization of the IGR.

2-12. IGR TO Structure. The IGR, for administrative control and training purposes will be constituted per this section, or as changed and approved in the future.

- a. One Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment.
- b. Four Brigade Headquarters.
- c. Twelve Battalion Headquarters.
- d. Forty Eight Companies.
- e. One Support Command with One Military Police Company.
- f. ■ One Training Academy (Cadre and Students).

2-13. Personnel. The IGR will be composed of officers and such other Citizens who shall volunteer or enlist for service therein, who meet qualifications prescribed in Chapter 3 of this regulation.

2-14. Authorization Documents. TO's, TE's, and TA's applicable to the units organized will be issued and revised as required to support and equip units activated.

2-15. Command and Supervision. The Adjutant General is the designated executive representative of the Governor for State military matters. The Commanding General, Indiana Guard Reserve is charged with the supervision, coordination, and administration of the IGR in conformity with the policies and procedures approved by TAG.
