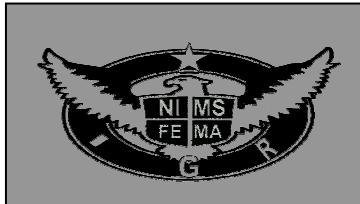

### IGR NIMS Trainers Earn Awards

### Operations Orders/Plans and Incident Action Plans:

Effective 1 April 2009, it was the decision of the G-3 that Op Orders will still be done to comply with military protocol, and they would be done by the G-3 Operations Officer.

If you are assigned as the project officer or Officer in Charge of an event you will need to do an Incident Action Plan for those soldiers participating in the event to get a practicum credit for MEMS. This will be done by completing the following IC forms:

IC 202  
IC 203  
IC 204  
IC 205  
IC 215a Safety Officer Issues

This is only for planning the event. If you have taken IC 300 and/or IC 400 you have these forms already, then get with someone in your unit to assist you.

### NEW NIMSCAST REQUIREMENTS FOR 2010:

Effective immediately to comply with our 2010 NIMSCAST Account requirements we need personnel in the following areas to complete the following IS courses at the EMI website for independent study.

IS 701: Multiagency Coordination Centers (MACC): All G-3 S-3's and NCOIC's

IS 702: Public Information Officer: All PAO's

IS 703: Resource Management: All G-4 and S4 personnel

IS 704: Communications: All personnel assigned to the C-6

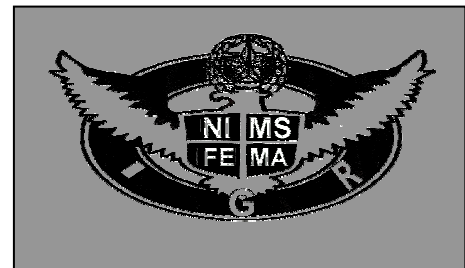

### Substitute Classes for IC 300 and IC 400

**Note: These are for MEMS Certification ONLY!**

If you cannot attend a G 300 or G 400 Course, we now have a substitute independent study program in place of it. However, before you can take these courses online you must have the approval of the MEMS State Director or Deputy Director. This response will be in writing. Indiana has plenty of these courses available. If you are E7 or above you must attend the classroom portions of this program to count for the NIMSCAST. Approval for the substitute courses will be done on a case by case basis, and they have to be approved prior to taking them. If you take them prior to approval for MEMS they will not count.

Q 534 Intro to Terrorism is a required course for MEMS Basic Certification effective 21 February 2009. However, many of you are having difficulty registering for the course.

You may now use the University of Kentucky Introduction to Terrorism Course as a substitute for the Q 534 course. Here is the website to find the course: Remember, Q 534 is the preferred course.

1. Make sure that I have an updated FEMA transcript.
2. Make sure I have copies of the following certificates as well:
  - A. AWR 160
  - B. IC 300 and IC 400
  - C. Q 534 from the National Fire Academy.

All these requirements are still intact and must be completed for advancing in the MEMS academy.
